your eyes only as I have not told my parental units.

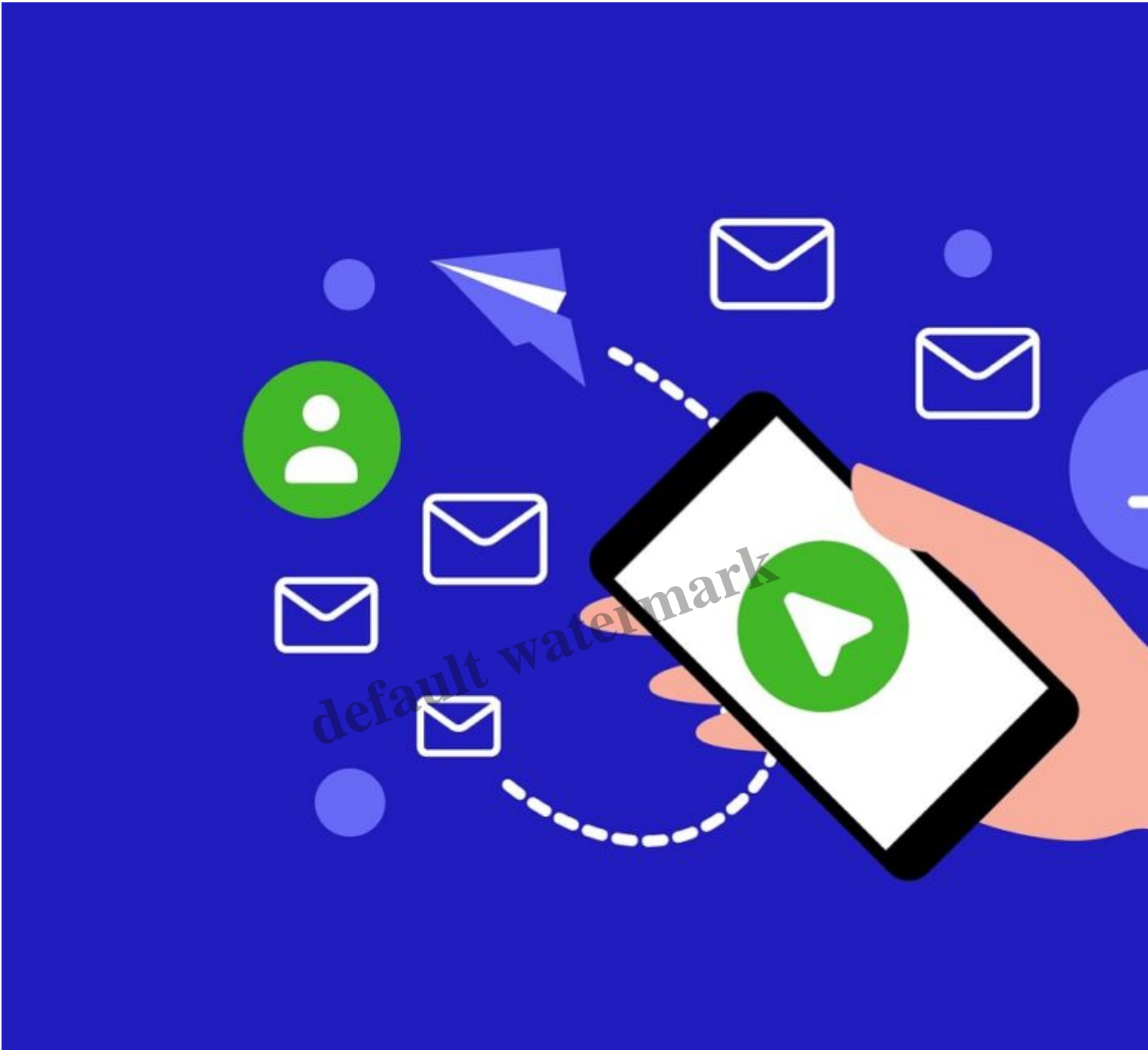
Thanks again for the Christmas check and I'll spend
